Transport

Silverdale railway station is a 30 min walk. Trains from Barrow, Lancaster and Manchester.

There is parking on the beach at the end of Shore Road but this floods during high tides. You can park anywhere in the village observing the usual considerations.

Tides

Some of the routes are tidal but you can always access El Barranco and Sector Duro from the top. Tides below 9 metres don't reach the coast but as a general rule of thumb, mid-day tides are usually high. Tides can come in very quickly and the biggest danger is getting cut off by the costal channels. Use one the Tide Tides apps

The Rock

There are some sections of good rock and lots of loose rock. Helmets are strongly recommended.

The Bolts

All the routes are closely bolted with stainless glue-ins.

The Village

Pubs, cafes a Coop and other shops. Please support local businesses.

Toilets

Public toilets opposite the chemist in the centre of the village

Weather

The open westerly aspect means that many of the routes are climbable through the winter and dry fast after rain in the summer.

Other climbing in the area

Trowbarrow is close by. Woodwell has lots of short trad routes and some hard bouldering. Jack Scout Cove, has a number of trad routes.

Equipping and new routes

As part of the access agreement with the National Trust and AONB there should be no more new routes without prior agreement. Climbers should avoid removal of vegetation or rock and any disturbance of the clifftop area.




Safety

There are two large campsites in the village and an abundance of caravan sites. Please don't light fires on the coast.






Closely bolted moderate routes. Care required reaching the belays. A good place to start.

- 3. Pedro's Other Route 6b+


4. Flat Capped Despot 6c+ A perplexing start leads to a hard finish.



No sun but stays dry in westerly weather. Non tidal and can be accessed from the top path.

- 1. **Michelangelo 7a+** Sit down start in the shallow grave for full value. Red choss to the left is out of bounds.
- 2. **Tony Greenbank 7a+ (TR)** One of the greats!
- 3. Gaudi 6b+ T Steep climbing.


4. **El Greco 6b** Traverse in from the right to get the full pump.



One hard route and two beginners routes.

- 1. Pillar 6b+ X Nice rock but awkward climbing.
- 2. **Groove 4+** X Nice climbing up the corner. Bolted for beginners.
- 3. **Kids Route 3** Steep start onto the slab. Bolted for kids.






- 1. Caudillo 6a/6c+ Use the crack on the left to make it easier. Possibly the worst route on the Costa.
- 2. **Generalisimo 7a** *** Excellent technical face climbing. Possibly the best route on the Costa.
- 3. **Falange 6a+** ** Off-width skills required. Beware the loose action in the middle.

- Jefe 6b+ ★★Steep start then pull through the overhangs onto the front face.
- 5. Capo 6b * Technical start then easy.
- 6. El Regalo 6a ★ The Gift. Climbed on Christmas Day 2020. Technical start then easy.
- 7. Papá Noel 5+ ** Another Christmas Day route. Nice Climbing.

Hueco Holes 6a









- 1. Roca a Cabeza 7a ** Painful pockets but ultimately satisfying.
- 2. **Hueco Holes 6a** The first route on the Costa.
- 3. **Feliz Navidad 6b** Technical climbing on good rock. Tricky to flash, no Christmas gift!

4. Feliz Año 6a+ Same first bolt as Navidad. Good rock.




Good puppy routes. Often dry when everything else is wet in the winter. Great for training laps. Tidal.

- 1. **Appendectomy 6c** Boulder problem start on the hanging flute. Good climbing.
- 2. Warm up 6a+ X Nice juggy climbing.

4. La Carbróna 6b Through the small roof.



- 3. Los Granjeros Pajeros 7a * * * Excellent technical climbing.
- 4. Homage To Catalonia 6c+ X X A sought after on-sight. Great climbing with a powerful crux.
- 5. Top Rope Directional bolt at the top

- 6. La Sardana 6c * Double bulge action.
- 7. Top Rope 7a
- 8. Flamenco 6b+
- 9. POUM 6b+ Tood climbing through the twin bulges.
- 10. EL Chapo 7b XXXX Greg Chapman solo, above mats !!
