

FRCC Members - Terms & Conditions for Hut Use

1) Members are required to assess the environment at the FRCC mountaineering huts they use. The huts are designed primarily as safe refuges where members can shelter from the weather, eat and sleep. They are in locations where alternative affordable or sometimes any accommodation is not available. The huts are often repurposed old buildings with constraints imposed by the structure, limitations on privacy and personal space and enforced personal interactions arising from shared, small or crowded dormitories and kitchens.

2) Members must assess their own ability to adapt to the hut environment and bring to the attention to each member of any group they bring the need for each person to assess their ability in the environment of a hut, giving particular attention to any:

- personal physical impairments or frailties including loss of sight or hearing;
- temporary or other sicknesses they have or potentially may be developing that could be passed on to other occupants of the hut;
- allergies that could lead to them becoming ill or cause distress to others.

3) Members must have read the hut byelaws, the fire safety advice and have considered the potential need to leave the premises when smoke and fire are present, act responsibly in their implementation and interpretation, and advise members of their group to comply.
